


NHTSA Impaired Driving Update

Report on Interlock Data Utilization Released

(DOT HS 812 445; August 2017) [This](#) report summarizes findings on ignition interlock data used for DWI offender monitoring, and offender screening, assessment, and treatment for alcohol abuse problems and how interlock data can be used effectively to reduce recidivism. The exploratory study examined the use of interlock data in nine states and the resulting report highlights procedures for using interlock data, compares the differences between state programs, identifies challenges and proposed solutions for the use of interlock data.

Medication Effects That May Impair Driving Ability WebMD/Medscape Training Program

WebMD has launched free webinar to educate and increase awareness among clinicians regarding the potential adverse effects of prescription and Over-the-Counter (OTC) medication use on driving. This webinar is geared towards encouraging clinicians to communicate these risks to their patients, to help decrease the likelihood of fatal and serious injury due to impaired driving crashes. At the end of the webinar, clinicians (including physicians, physician assistants, nurses, pharmacists and pharmacy technicians) will have greater knowledge regarding the potential adverse effects of OTC and prescription medication that may impair driving ability among drivers and strategies to mitigate these adverse effects.


