



## New NCSA Publications

### Early Estimates of Motor Vehicle Traffic Crashes for the First Quarter of 2018

(DOT HS 812 586) A statistical projection of traffic fatalities for the first quarter of 2018

shows that an estimated 7,850 people died in motor vehicle traffic crashes.

This represents a decrease of about 3.6 percent as compared to 8,250 fatalities that were projected to have occurred in the first quarter of 2017. Preliminary data reported by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) shows that vehicle miles traveled (VMT) in the first 3 months of 2018 increased by about 2.5 billion miles, or about a 0.3-percent increase. **Using Drones in Crash Investigations**

The Michigan State Police (MSP) have been using Unmanned Aircraft System technology (UAS and also commonly referred to as drones) since 2015 and have logged over 500 missions. One of the key uses for drones is crash scene reconstruction. Throwing a drone in the air and taking a bunch of crash scene photos may seem easier and quicker than pulling out a total station and spending hours logging points with a data collector.
